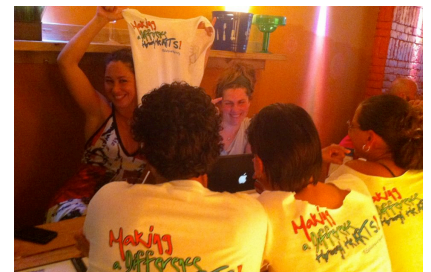
"Odd Life..." Sock Drive:

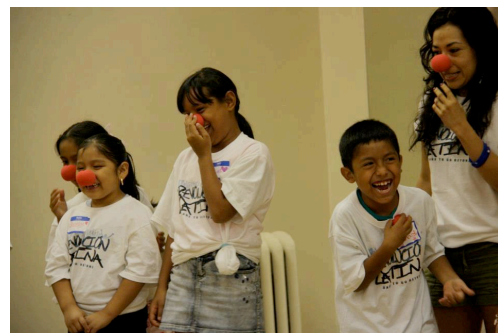
5th Annual D2GB Children's Performing Arts Camp is a success!
